2nd Annual Film Festival & Oil City's OIL 150 Kickoff Event

The region's 2nd Annual Film Festival, hosted by the Venango Digital Film Association, will feature a nationwide script writing competition with the theme of "Oil Boom Days in Western Pennsylvania". This event will serve as Oil City's kickoff event for our OIL 150 celebration and dignitaries will make opening remarks beginning at 6:30 p.m. The showing of films will begin at 7:00 p.m.

The winning screenplays will be filmed and premiered here and will go on to compete in the Great Lakes Film Festival. The resulting film will belong to the community and will be available for screening throughout the OIL150 celebration. The event will take place at the Crawford Center in Emlenton, Pa, on Sept. 12; The Latonia in Oil City, Pa. on Sept. 13; and, The Barrow Civic in Franklin, Pa. on September 14. 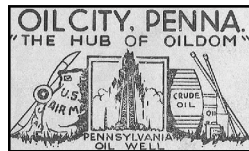

"Colonel" Edwin L. Drake and the Seneca Oil Company struck oil in Venango County near Titusville, Pa. in 1859. In the aftermath, the entire region prospered and was the world's hub of the oil and pipeline industry. Oil City, Pa. has often been referred to as the "Hub of Oildom."

In that August 27, 2009 marks the 150th anniversary of oil, Pennsylvania's Oil Heritage Region is commemorating its proud heritage in the oil industry with an OIL 150 Celebration that begins on August 1, 2008 and extends through December 31, 2009.
